

Community Garden Irrigation System

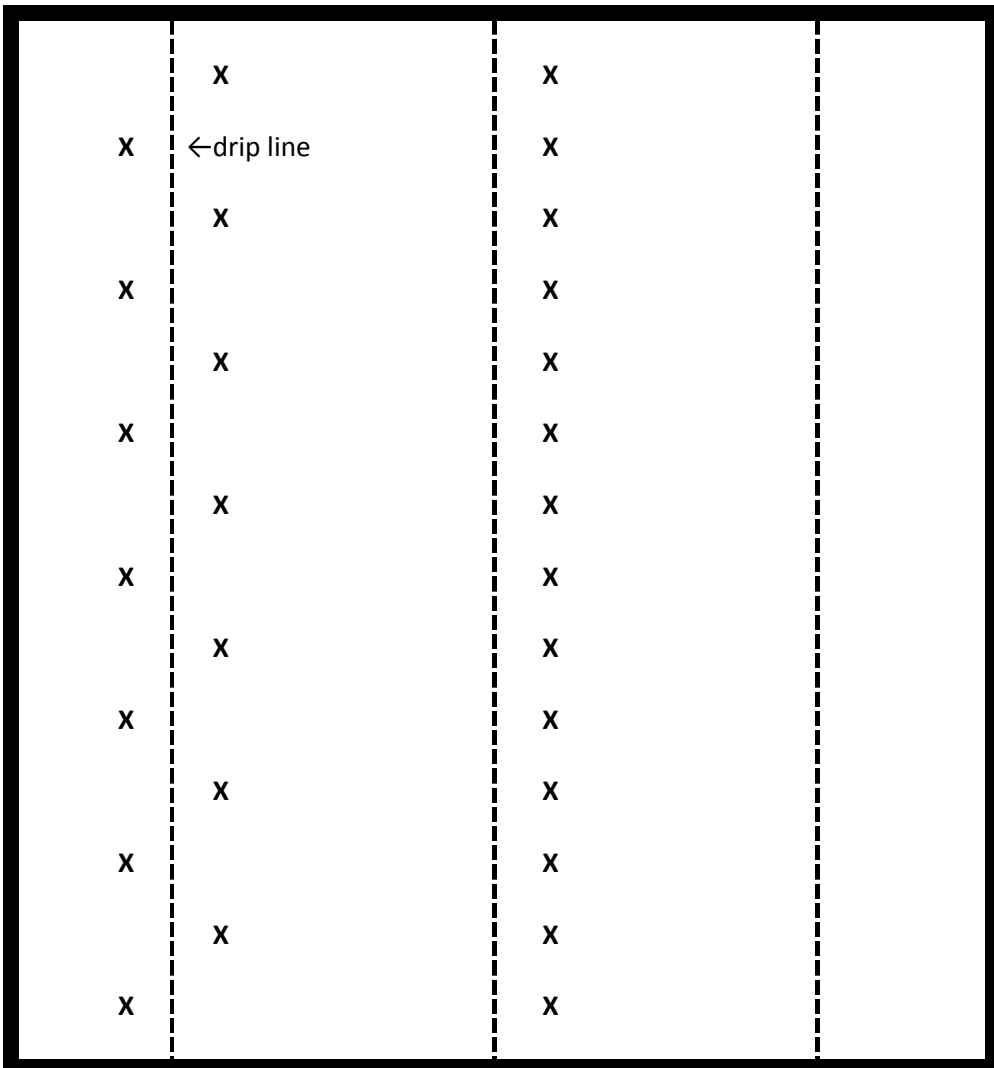
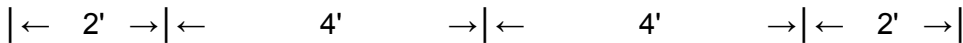
The garden is watered with drip irrigation. Each plot has 3 drip irrigation lines buried approximately 2" deep, and 4' apart. (See diagram below). The advantages of using drip irrigation are:

- 1) More efficient use of water
- 2) Reduced weed growth between rows
- 3) Reduced foliar disease (leaves are not wetted)

The limited lateral (sideways) water movement in the sandy soil means that the garden plants (**X** on diagram below) **must be located within 6 - 12" of an irrigation line.**

Please be careful when planting. Do not cut or break the drip line (black with blue line).

It is suggested that plants be manually watered when *initially* planting (approximately 1 pint/plant). *Once established*, additional hand-watering should not be needed.
